Among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Franklin:


- 92% of Black defendants (254 out of 276)
- 79% of Hispanic White defendants (92 out of 116)
- 80% of non-Hispanic White defendants (164 out of 205)

were detained per night based on inability to pay

Last week, among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Franklin, 92% of Black defendants (254 out of 276 on an average night), 79% of Hispanic White defendants (92 out of 116 on an average night), and 80% of non-Hispanic White defendants (164 out of 205 on an average night) were detained in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Franklin's racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% best in Harris County. Her racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% best in Harris County.
